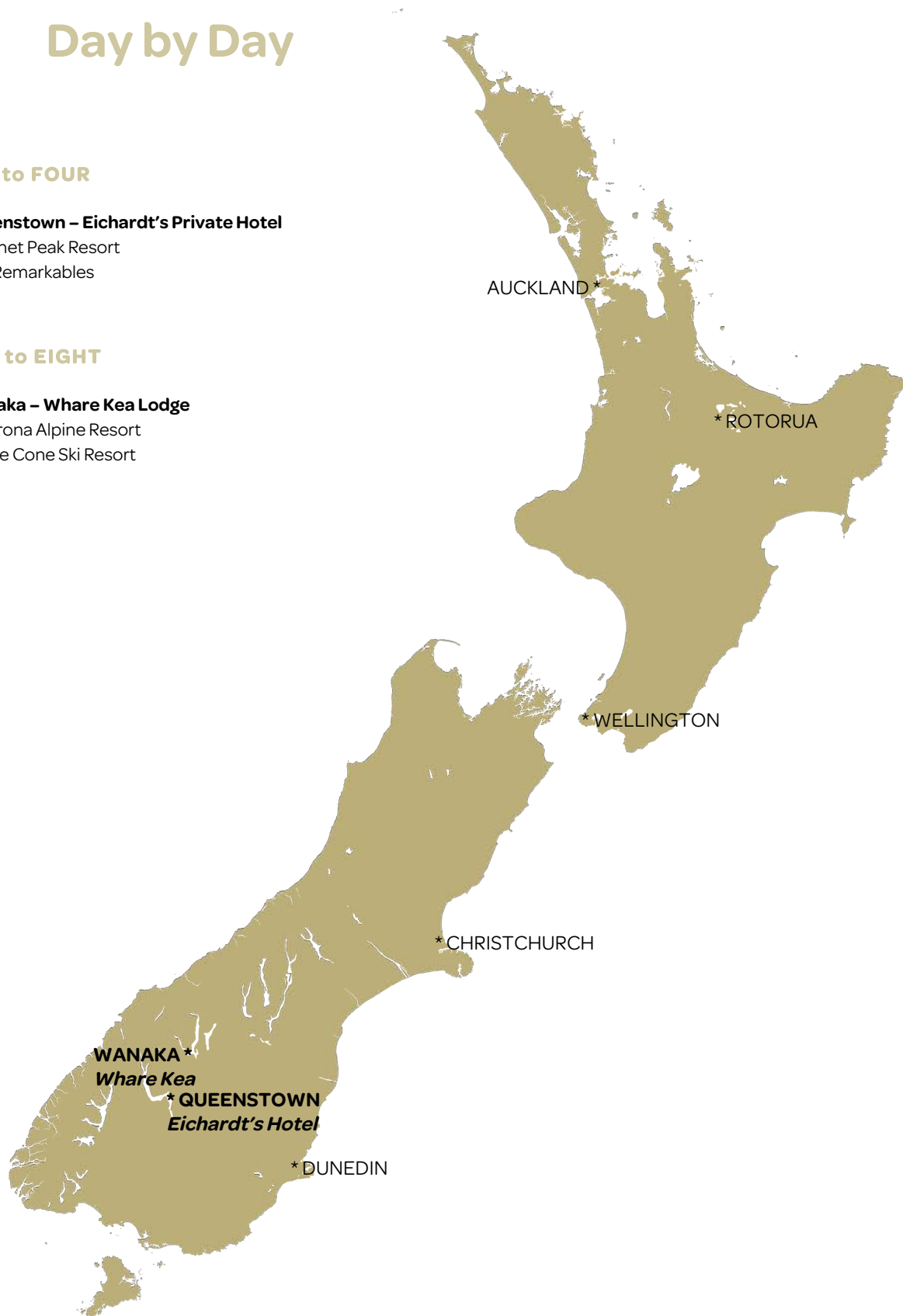

Whether it be 'carving it up' at the recently refurbished Coronet Peak or over the valley at the beautiful Remarkables Ski Area, you will never want for a view and if the last few seasons are something to go by, the snow will be great too...

Should the weather be a hindrance at any stage in Queenstown, there are a huge number of activities to keep even the most active traveler occupied. On offer are the famous Bungy jumps, jet boating trips, Skyline Gondola and luge facility right down to the quaint pubs bars and cafes of Queenstown. One must-visit is to Patagonia, a superb little chocolate haven right on the Steamer Wharf.

Today you will be making your way over to Wanaka where you will find privacy and seclusion like no other. Leaving Queenstown, the Wakatipu basin is a sight in itself as you wind your way up and over the Crown Range (provided there's not some fresh powder on the hills) – your guide will be sure to stop at the top so take a photo and breath in the wintery magnificence.

Lunch is along the way at the Cardrona Pub, an amazing little gold-mining pub that is 'world famous in New Zealand'. The goldrush was rampant right through Central Otago in the late 1800's and small relics like this are an experience in themselves, not to mention the superb apres-ski ambiance after a great day up at Cardrona, one of Wanaka's fantastic resorts.

Following lunch and as you enter Wanaka you will immediately see why it's the place that Kiwi's come to holiday and ski. The snow-capped mountains in the distance, the crystal clear and often cool lake and the small but vibrant town that hosts you all make this place unforgettable.

Dinner tonight will no doubt be a masterpiece as your personal Whare Kea chef whips up local New Zealand fare. A glass of Pinot Noir from the neighbouring Rippon vineyard is compulsory...

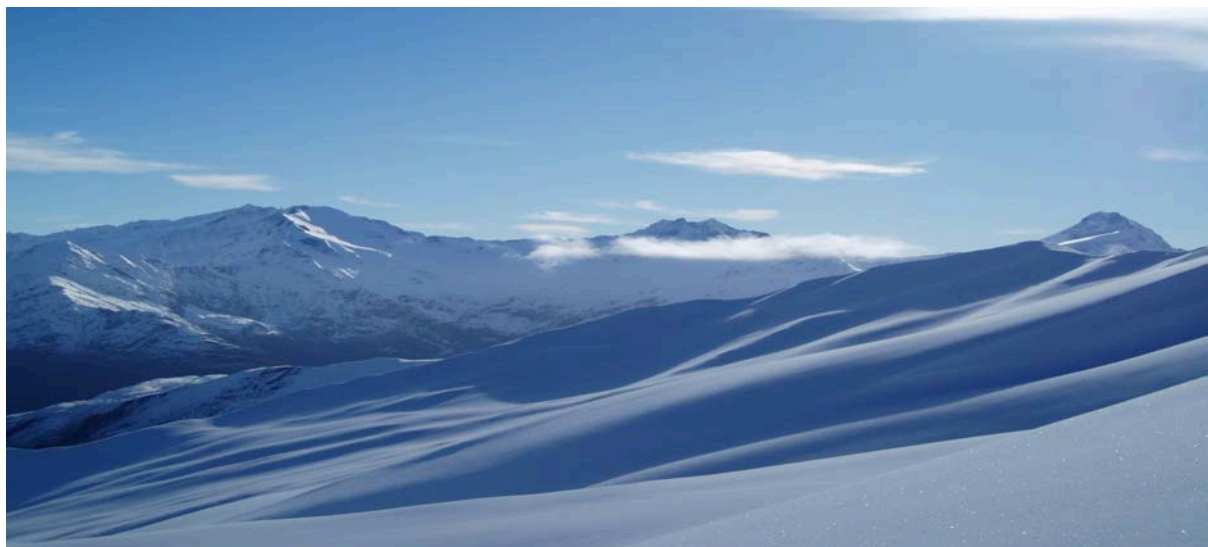

This morning will no doubt be one of those mornings where having woken up and seen the dusting of fresh snow, even breakfast (despite it being so amazing) will seem to take too long. With thoughts drifting to that first chairlift ride and those untouched powder turns. The best thing you can do is have a good hearty breakfast, make triple sure you have the boots (both of them) and do your stretches!

Treble Cone, Cardrona or the Snow Park are the mountains of choice in this winter region with Cardrona being the option for the more cautious of skiers boasting an excellent kids facility, nice easy-going groomed runs. Something for those adventurous young 'gromets' is Snow Park – halfpipes and jumps galore. Treble Cone on the other hand has a stunning (read exciting) drive up, welcoming you with great open bowls, steep runs and a view that is second to absolutely nothing on this earth – seriously.

The days end - the body is feeling it, the legs are sore but the excitement is still growing so if Cardrona was mountain of choice today, it's time to grab a core-warming mulled wine back at the Cardrona Pub and all it's gold-mining charm. If today was at Treble Cone, the lodge is worth relaxing back into as driving past the gate to go into town may not be too appealing..

- **Wake up, have some amazing fuel and triple check the gear – have you got it all?**
- **Drive up to Cardrona or Treble Cone and ski the day away**
- **Finish the day in style with some apres-ski**
- **Relax, unwind and have a sumptuous winter feast**



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Day 9 – Departure Day

Having no doubt had some great snow, skied those buns off and seen some stunning local sights, today is the day you leave our snowy wonderland.

You will again be on hand to transfer you back over to Queenstown however before you go anywhere, you need to return all your ski rental equipment, be it in Wanaka or back in Queenstown.

A brief little wine excursion is a great last idea too... You will no doubt head through Bannockburn and the Central Otago vineyards of Mount Difficulty, Carrick Estate and Amisfield to top it all off – the lunch menu (not to mention the Pinot Noir) is superb.

Well... All great wintery things must come to an end however we do hope you have enjoyed every minute of your skiing time here in New Zealand.
